## **P** BE AN ADVOCATE

- Write letters to your editor on issues that affect animals, such as puppy mills or community cats
- 2. Report animal cruelty

- Determine which elected officials represent you at local, state, and federal levels
- Learn what legislation is now pending in Congress, and contact your federal and state legislators
- Work for the passage of local ordinances in your community, for example to protect chained dogs or end the use of wild animal acts
- 6. Participate in Humane Lobby
  Days (in Annapolis each
  February) to talk directly with
  your state legislators about
  making laws that protect
  animals
- 7. Talk to friends & family about the importance of pet adoption
  - 8. Support local businesses that are pet-friendly
  - Encourage others not to buy from puppy mills
  - 10.Avoid any form of

entertainment that involves the use of animals



### **PRAISE FUNDS**

- Make a personal annual gift or sign up for an automatic monthly pledge on your credit card
- Make a tribute gift in honor of a friend or animal companion
- 3. Donate your vehicle
- 4. Buy a license plate
- 5. Buy a shirt or magnet at an event or from our online store
- 6. Support a fundraiser
- 7. Sponsor an event
- Include HSHC as a beneficiary in your will
- Shop through Amazon Smile and a portion will be donated back to HSHC
- 10. Create a Facebook fundraiser for your birthday
- 11. Explore the different naming opportunities at the shelter
- 12. Collect aluminum cans and recycle them for cash



- 13. Celebrate a birthday, anniversary or other important milestone by making a tribute gift in a loved one's name

### **GET INVOLVED**

- Foster a litter of kittens until they are old enough to be adopted
- 2. Volunteer (when the shelter is able to safely open again)
- Adopt your new best friend from a shelter or rescue group
- 4. Purchase and donate an item from our wish list
- Attend one of our free monthly Lunch & Learns
- Distribute flyers at events and stores
- 7. Call office supply stores to see if there are items they are willing to donate, such as printer paper or pens
- Call pet supply or grocery stores to see if they have damaged (but still usable) items they can donate
- Know a professional?
   Carpenters, plumbers and other professionals can help out with needed repairs and upkeep around the shelter

### **TAKE ACTION AT**

#### HOME

- 1. Turn your outdoor space into a backyard sanctuary
- Place bird boxes in your garden
- Plant flowers for butterflies and bees
- 4. Find humane ways to deal with unwanted wildlife
- Put your pet's excess fur outside for birds to use in their nests
- I.D. your animals with collars, tags & microchips and encourage others to do the same
- Keep your cats safe indoors and keep dogs on leashes when off your property
- 8. Prepare a disaster kit for your animals
- 9. Spay or neuter your pet
- 10. Provide for your animals' future in case you can't care for them
- 11. Report animal abuse
- 12. Purchase cosmetics and other household products that are not tested on animals

- 13.Donate your FreshStep paw points so they shelter can get free kitty litter
- 14.Clean up litter from a local park or trail
- 15. In lieu of birthday gifts, ask for donations for the animals
- 16.Learn pet massage for your pets



- 17.Use paper or fabric shopping bags
- 18. Recycle and reduce waste
- 19.Grow or go organic in your own garden
- 20.Learn how to support endangered animals
- 21.Try a meatless meal every Monday
- 22. Be chic in fur-free fashion




## **GET CRAFTY**
